Attended Alma College for two years:

Was on the Snow Oueen Court - never believed that would happen!!!

Got engaged to high school sweetheart, Craig WALKER; wisely figured out that was NOT going to work.

In the summer of 1967, was invited to Germany to be with Liesel, the exchange student that had lived with out family during my junior year in high school. Had to get rid of a German soldier who got a bit too frisky on the train to Hanover. This was before I had even gotten to Liesel. Gained lots of weight eating those pomme frites and amazing German desserts.

Before leaving on the trip, was invited by my high school drama coach (who had moved out here) to spend a week in CA checking out the theater scene. Stayed with a cousin - Mom said that was the only reason this trip was allowed!! playhouse. Had the chance to check out a few of Phil's rough drafts of the Playboy Queenie cartoon when earning some extra money as his house keeper.

A high school friend joined me as roommate and we had great fun together. Watermelon seed spitting contests in the middle of the apartment complex parking lot. I think she decided she preferred snow to earthquakes, so moved back to MI.

At the urging of my cousin, also joined the Anaheim Choraleers, directed by Sheldon Disrud, which is where I met my hubby. Entranced by the guy's singing. Had amazing musical experiences because of his being a part of the Roger Wagner Chorale. The men from the group were the chorus in "Paint Your Wagon". CTB won tickets to its premiere. Sat right behind the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band. Loved being at as many rehearsals as I could get to, especially when they included the likes of Norman Triegle, Dave Brubeck, Zubin Mehta, and Giullini. Amazing!!

Craig's varied interest and desire to try lots of things got me involved in doing lots of things, too. Got so I could paint and clean a one bedroom apartment all by myself in one day. Was when Shawn was young, so just took her along. Got interested in nutrition; always liked exercising, so became Jazzercise student in 1981. Became instructor in 1984.
